The Czech Republic is a country of paddlers. Various forms of canoeing and water activities do not only have a long tradition, the water slalom and wildwater canoeing is historically and currently one of the most successful sports here. In the South Bohemian region, the effect is reinforced by the traditional canoeing terrains in Šumava, including the famous Lipno area, canoeing classics such as the Vltava, Lužnice, Otava, and finally the vast water areas of the ponds around Třeboň.

ARTIFICIAL COURSE OF LÍDA POLESNÁ IN ČESKÉ VRBNÉ

The area is located at the point where the Vltava. River leaves the town of České Budějovice towards Hluboká nad Vltavou. The artificial slalom course was created in the 1980s by converting a part of the original meandering Vltava riverbed into a slalom course and building the hydroelectric power station in České Vrbné that provides a course with sufficient water gradient. The course was continuously improved and modified. The big evolution came in 2010-2012, when the middle part was completely rebuilt using brand new RapidBlocs system. Changes have also been made to other parts of the course so now it is possible to use two easier courses and another challenging one for training or racing.

Out of respect for Lída Polesná, a four-times slalom world champion, the whole area was named after her.



BACKGROUND

The great adventure of the artificial slalom course have always been the accompanied facilities. Visitors can use the campsite or hostel, have something to eat in the restaurant or play in the playground with their kids. Everything is connected by a cycle path with nearby České Budějovice or the extremely popular chateau Hluboka nad Vltavou. Both are accessible by bicycle or roller skates, as well as by regular boat or public transport.

Thanks to this, the area has always been a popular place for multi-day sports camps, various types of competitions, sporting events and cultural events, too. The complex is actually an island between the slalom course (i.e. the original riverbed) and the new straightened riverbed of the Vltava River. And as an island of well-being, good mood and sport in nature, it never fails to impresses.

With a population of 94,000, the statutory city of České Budějovice is the capital of the South Bohemian Region. Situated at the confluence of the Vltava and Malše rivers surrounded by charming countryside, the city covers an area of 56 square kilometres.

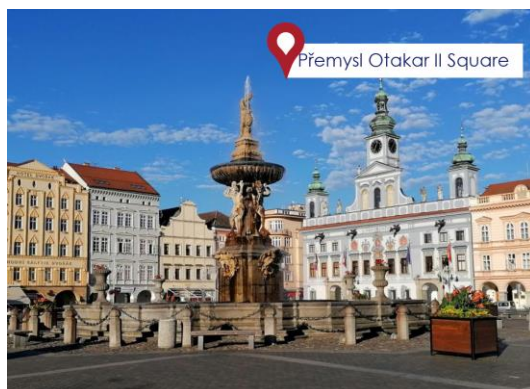
Due to its numerous architectural and artistic heritage sites, the historic city centre has been declared an urban heritage reserve and contains the most tourist attractions. These include the famous **Přemysl Otakar II Square**, named after the city's medieval founder. From the bird's-eye view, the almost regular square shape surprises with a surrounding perpendicular grid of streets.

The dominant building among the Baroque and Renaissance buildings with arcades around the square is the **Baroque Town Hall**. The four stone statues set among the three city hall spires are an allegory of the civic virtues: Justice, Courage, Wisdom and Prudence.

The jewel in the center of the square is the baroque **Samson's Fountain**, the largest of its kind in Bohemia, featuring a sculpture of the legendary hero Samson fighting the lion.

The domination of the city center is the **Black Tower** – a 72-meter tall belfry and city watchtower. Its gallery provides a stunning view of České Budějovice and its surroundings.

The tower was built in the Renaissance style by the councilors in the 16th century. To the right of the tower is the **Cathedral of St. Nicholas**. The austere baroque structure was built in the mid-17th century after the beautiful late gothic cathedral was destroyed by fire. The list of the sights is even longer: the Dominican Monastery with the Church of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Salt Store, the remnants of fortification, the Rabenstein Tower and the Iron Maiden...

BY PLANE

For regular access by plane, we recommend to choose one of the nearest airports:

- Prague (PRG), • Linz (LNZ), • Vienna (VIE)

Then use the public transport (train, bus) to get to the České Budějovice railway station. In case of a private flight, it is possible to contact the České Budějovice Airport directly on its official website: www.airport-cb.cz/en/.

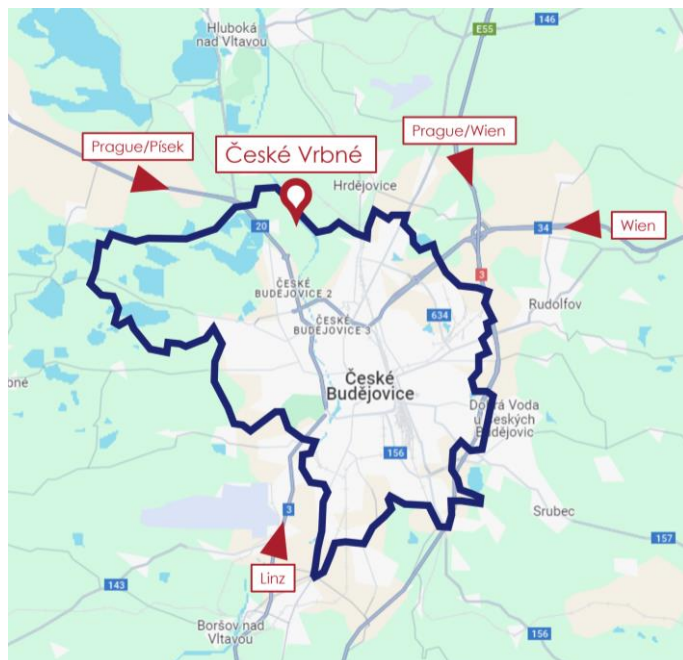


BY CAR

Arrival from Písek/Prague (road no. 20): at the first traffic light turn the left towards Ceske Vrbne and after 800m you will arrive at the complex.

Arriving from the direction of Prague, Vienna (road no. 23): follow the signs in the direction of Písek / Plzeň. At the last traffic light at the exit from the town (you will see the Bauhaus shopping centre on your left) turn the right towards Ceske Vrbne and after 800 m you will arrive at the complex.

From the direction of Linz take the D3 motorway to exit 141 on the 143 road and continue towards České Budějovice. Drive straight through the entire town until you reach the junction by the Bauhaus, where you turn right towards České Vrbné and the canoeing area.



BY BUS OR TRAIN

Destination: České Budějovice bus/train station

Then take line 9 to the České Vrbné terminal station and walk from there about 800 m or ride a bike, which can be easily rented at the terminal station.

From the station it is also possible to use shared bicycles and take the cycle path leading through the historic centre to reach the place.

TRAINING POSSIBILITIES



During the 2025 season, two wildwater competitions will be held on the slalom course before the Wildwater Sprint World Championships:

- 10.-11.5. 2025 – ECA Wildwater Canoeing Sprint European Cup (Race 5)
- 29.-31.8. 2025 – Czech National Wildwater Canoeing Sprint Cup

We highly recommend that you take advantage of the opportunity to train on the course on these dates, when it is always possible to use the entire course for downriver boats from at least Friday before the race weekend.
